Their final webinar: **The tension between formative and summative assessment in CBME**, will be held Thursday, June 23 at 11am. Register here.



She will direct the admissions process, provide support and guidance to RAPS students and faculty, supervise the progression of students through the program, lead ongoing curriculum development, and pursue training grant funding.
