


FHL blends 3.5 days of in-person content with a year of executive coaching to ensure success in meeting the participant's developmental goals.



Virtual MERC Program



The AAMC is pleased to announce the launch of recurrent virtual Medical Education Research Certificate (MERC) workshops beginning this summer, and thereafter on a quarterly basis.

The MERC program is open to individuals that are interested in improving their educational research skills and is primarily targeted for those with a background in medical education, but relatively less experience in educational research.

Each three-hour virtual workshop will focus on a key skill or area in educational research and emphasize opportunities for active participation to maximize applicability of workshop principles. Those participating in at least six workshops will receive a MERC certificate.
