Chung Awarded Education and Research Foundation Grant



Dr. Koong-Nah Chung has been awarded the DeNardo Education and Research Foundation Grant. This award will provide stipends to train 4 WUSM medical students to conduct biomedical research in the Yearlong Research Program (YRP). The DeNardo Foundation has awarded Dr. Chung a total of \$300,000 during the past 12 years: 10 years for the Summer Research Program and 4 years for the YRP.
