




WUSM Explore Program Holds Inaugural Inquiry Symposium



In December, our inaugural Gateway Curriculum class shared their scholarly work as part of the Inquiry Symposium, hosted by our EXPLORE Program. Five projects were selected for Oral Presentation, and many more were celebrated in a virtual symposium structure. We had over 50 of our WUSM faculty members in attendance to hear about our students' work, and to provide feedback on presentations. We celebrated our student projects addressing diverse healthcare problems, including addressing malnutrition using the microbiome, association of medicaid enrollment timing with breast cancer outcomes, factors influencing representation in neurosurgical careers, using artificial intelligence in patient care, and much more. The Washington University in St. Louis, School of Medicine Student Interprofessional Clinic was established to provide interim, high-quality, traumainformed interprofessional care to medically under resourced patients referred for care by designated colleagues in the WUSM Department of Neurology and Emergency Department.

Under the supervision of dedicated faculty, students of Medicine, Occupational Therapy, and Physical Therapy, will deliver free services in the 4444 building until patients can be connected to ongoing primary care services in the community through our Community Referral Coordinator (CRC), Brittany Jones through the Integrated Health Network.

This clinic will operate on Friday afternoons in an initial pilot phase. There are no volunteer opportunities at this time.


